# Dear Guild Members:

As we settle into a new calendar year, you are asked to make a firm resolution to "storm heaven" with prayers that Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney will soon be beatified, the next step in his cause for canonization and



eventual sainthood. With beatification he would be called Blessed Michael J. McGivney. His holiness of life and heroic virtue were officially recognized in 2008, when the Vatican bestowed on him the title of venerable. A miracle through his intercession is now needed for his cause to move to the next level. As you can read in each copy of this newsletter, many favors are granted through devoted prayer to Father McGivney, and we know that he is active in the lives of his Knights and their families. But most of these favors, though significant, do not qualify for what the Vatican would accept as miraculous. The standards of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints are understandably high, and usually a medical healing is needed to meet them.

The Guild is fortunate always to have under investigation a report of an extraordinary medical event, so we urge you to pray that the incident currently being investigated will eventually be accepted as miraculous. From other causes, we know that it often takes many years for such a miracle to be approved, but we should also recall the words of Our Lord that by asking we shall receive. Perseverance in this prayer of petition is one of the best ways we can imitate Father McGivney himself, who never gave up on following the inspirations of the Holy Spirit, with confidence and hope.

We should remember that his path to founding the Knights of Columbus was far from smooth and at one point he wrote that his new fraternity had nearly died before being fully formed. His exaggerated expression highlighted a deep frustration over the lack of progress of an organization that he knew would benefit Catholic men and their families; but Father McGivney did not let disappointment overtake him. His sure and steady will and vision should be an inspiration to Knights today who may be discouraged by the difficulties within the Church or a lack of enthusiasm or commitment among Catholic men they seek to recruit. In all your meetings, and before setting out on any charitable or recruitment program, pray fervently to Father McGivney. Ask the founder for strength and a holy zeal as you join with brother Knights on the good works of our Order.

Just think of the immense spirit of hope and hard work that went into the early years of the Knights, growing from one council in New Haven, with a handful of parish men. It spread across Connecticut, to Massachusetts and other states, into Canada and Mexico and then overseas to the Philippines. More recently, the Order has been established

# HEART OF A PRIEST



The incorrupt heart of St. Jean Vianney is shown within an antique reliquary in the Holy Family Chapel at the Knights of Columbus headquarters.

A major relic of the patron of parish priests was brought to the hometown of the holy parish priest who founded the Knights of Columbus, to help commemorate Venerable Father Michael McGivney's first Mass after his ordination.

On the weekend of Dec. 22-23, 2018, the incorrupt heart of St. Jean Vianney was displayed for veneration in the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Waterbury, Conn., the parish where Father McGivney offered his first Mass after ordination, on Dec. 24, 1877. About 1,500 people from as far away as Springfield, Mass., came to the basilica to venerate the relic, including priests, seminarians and young families.

"We are very conscious of the legacy of Father McGivney in this parish and this city," said Father Christopher Ford, pastor of Immaculate Conception, where the prayer for canonization is recited after each Mass. "We pray that one day soon Venerable Father McGivney will join St. Jean Vianney as a canonized saint."

The heart relic has been entrusted to the Knights of Columbus by the Shrine in Ars, France, where St. Jean Vianney was pastor for more

than 40 years till his death in 1859. When his body was exhumed in preparation for his beatification, it was found to be incorrupt, and the heart was taken to serve as a sign of his burning love for God and penitents. Known as the Curé of Ars, he was famous throughout Europe as a confessor and spiritual counselor, spending up to 16 hours a day in the confessional, and was named patron of parish priests in 1929 by Pope Pius XI. In 2009 Pope Benedict XVI named him the patron of the Year for Priests.

The Knights of Columbus began a nationwide tour with the heart relic in early November at the historic St. Mary's Spiritual Center on Paca Street in Baltimore, where the seminarian Michael McGivney had prayed during his four years of priestly formation. More than 200 people came to the chapel to venerate the relic, and Dominican Father Jonathan Kalisch, director of chaplains and spiritual development for the Knights of Columbus, offered the opening Mass of the relic tour.

The relic also was available for veneration during a day of prayer at the U.S. bishops' annual meeting in Baltimore, November 12, and was later brought to two seminaries in the area, St. Mary's and Mount St. Mary's. It was present for two days at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, where Father McGivney founded the Order in 1882, and served as the centerpiece when the parish observed a Solemn Vigil for Purification in reparation for the sins committed by clergymen over the years.

The relic was displayed at the St. John Paul II National Shrine and the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, both in Washington, D.C., with Mass offered in the latter site by Archbishop Christophe Pierre, apostolic nuncio. It also was brought on pilgrimage through the Southeast and Midwest, and made a stop at the Indianapolis conference of the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS), which was attended by 16,000 young people. The saint's heart will make a West Coast trip from late February through early March.

The Knights of Columbus will continue the relic pilgrimage until early June, when it will be returned to the Shrine in Ars.



On the first day of the relic tour, Nov. 10, 2018, college students knelt to venerate the incorrupt heart of St. John Vianney. The relic began a nationwide tour at St. Mary's Spiritual Center in the restored chapel of the former seminary where Father McGivney studied for the priesthood.
