First Feast Day – August 13

Inen the Church declares someone "Blessed," she also determines the annual feast day for that person. Traditionally, the date chosen is the day of the person's death. The feast day, in the liturgy called a "memorial," marks the birthday into heaven of the

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blessed, the beginning of a new life in eternity. This year, on August 13, we celebrate for the first time the feast day, or memorial, of Blessed Michael McGivney. This is a day of great rejoicing for all Catholics but in a special way for the Church in Connecticut, for the 2 million Knights of Columbus throughout the United States and around the world, and for members of the Father McGivney Guild. On August 13, I will celebrate Mass for the intentions of all Guild members and their families with the special prayers for Father McGivney designated by the Church. Many other priests, especially those in the Archdiocese of Hartford, in which Father McGivney was born and died, also will offer Mass on the memorial of Blessed Michael McGivney.

While a feast day is usually assigned


by the Church for the day on which a saint or blessed died, sometimes that day is already taken by a major liturgical celebration or another canonized person. Blessed Michael McGivney died on August 14, the Vigil of the Solemnity of the Assumption. Since Vigil Masses fulfill the obligation to attend Mass in many places, the previous day, August 13, was chosen for the memorial of Blessed Michael McGivney since it falls between his August 12 birthday (1852) and the day of his death in 1890.

Guild members will be happy to hear that as news of his recent beatification spreads, awareness of and devotion to Blessed

McGivney grows. He has become a spiritual friend and advocate to many who previously had known little about him. Just within the last month, several people have told me about their recent confidence in turning to Blessed McGivney for his intercession in


> their family difficulties. One young father approached me in an airport to tell me of "the inspiration to turn to Father McGivney" and to have his prayers speedily answered.

My personal confidence in Father McGivney's holiness and the power of his intercession came about gradually. While researching his life and the world in which he lived, his strength of character became clear. He was shy and retiring by nature and did not possess a strong physical constitution. He had, in the jargon of his time, "a weak chest." His daily round of activities as a parish priest, which doubled when the pastors were themselves ill, witness to a heroic courage in responding his duties. It is not surprising that his health failed when he was only 38 years old. Above and beyond this remarkable willingness to serve the needs

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Even Unto Tears'

The following is an excerpt of an address given by Dominican Father Peter John Cameron during a vespers service in St. Mary's Church, New Haven, on Oct. 31, 2020, the evening of the beatification of Father McGivney. Father Cameron is author of a play about Father McGivney, He Was Our Father.

I hat was it that made Father McGivney so exquisitely sensitive to suffering? Perhaps it was the fact that he was the eldest of 13 children and had witnessed the deaths of six of his siblings as well as the awful toll that this took on his parents.

Maybe it was that he lost his own father when his dad was only 48 years old, leaving his mother a widow when she was yet a young woman. Or maybe, being frail of health, he understood vulnerability better than most.

He suffered criticism for being so self-giving, especially from his seminary rector in the last months before his priestly ordination. In the rector's final evaluation of McGivney, there's one point that he finds so awkward and embarrassing that he switches from English to Latin to camouflage the shocking, scandalous thing he

New Jersey

Recovery

My grandson, age 21, fell four stories from a balcony onto concrete and was not given much of a chance to live through the

night. He had massive brain damage, and they had to remove part of his skull to relieve pressure on his brain. They said even if he did live, there was not much hope for a quality life. He made it through the night. I asked my brother Knights to pray for him to Father McGivney, and they did. It has been six months now, and my grandson has been home for three months. He has recovered to about 80% of normal capacity and is going to rehab.

Nebraska

My 16-year-old daughter sustained a gymnastics injury to her elbow and was diagnosed with an OCD lesion. The doctor said it was unlikely to heal without surgery. We prayed to Blessed Michael McGivney for healing every night. Through several obstacles, including COVID and the Texas ice storm, surgery was never performed. My daughter could not compete in her level 10 gymnastics season. It has been six months, and now my daughter is doing gymnastics again, pain free, and has been contacted by college coaches!

A brother Knight had been in a near-fatal car accident and received a traumatic brain injury along with a broken rib and broken leg. A healing Mass was held for his recovery. I prayed to Blessed McGivney to heal our brother Knight. Soon after, he made a miraculous recovery.

North Dakota

Thank you, Father McGivney, for interceding for our Sister Helen, who had a serious infection that spread throughout her body and was 70 days in the hospital. Sister Peggy suggested that we pray to Blessed Michael McGivney, and all the Sisters of St. Joseph of Brentwood did just that. Sister Helen was discharged recently and was able to walk by herself into our residence. We know that Father McGivney was involved in her recovery. Praise God!

New York

A friend's test showed a tumor on his bladder. I started praying for him twice a day to Blessed McGivney and was very happy that the prayers were answered. The test was negative, and there was no cancer. I thank Blessed McGivney for answering my prayers.

Texas

After more than two years of physical therapy, epidurals, and nerve blocks, with nothing working, I started praying for the intercession of Father McGivney for a miracle that this last medical procedure would work. Even though it was an outpatient procedure, not only has it worked, but I've also avoided fusion surgery that I was terrified of. Some may think it's more science that has been my cure, but I'm thanking God and Father McGivney for this personal miracle.

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has to say. The rector writes, "In giving you this final evaluation of Mr. McGivney, I must say that Mr. McGivney is a very good and pious young man with good and attractive manner." But then the rector reverts to Latin: "He is exceedingly sensitive, *usque ad lacrimas*..." *Usque ad lacrimas* means "even unto tears." When Michael McGivney experienced the suffering of another, he was quickly moved to tears. He would cry.

But if you ask me, this is the very glory of Blessed Michael McGivney. So much so that if I were ever to found a religious community, I would want to found it in honor of Blessed Michael McGivney, and the community would be called the "Usque ad Lacrimasarians." And they would be people with tremendous

empathy for the suffering, the sorrowing, the poor, the afflicted, because we desperately need saints like that in our life today, right now. We need Blessed Michael McGivney.

Let's keep in our hearts what we proclaimed in that first psalm of tonight's evening prayer. "From His misery, the Lord raises the poor, to set them in the company of princes." Blessed Michael McGivney ... we look appealingly at you. Please raise us up from our misery, and set us in the company of princes, and of knights and of saints. Gain for us, with you, the grace to squander ourselves for Jesus Christ our Savior. Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.

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of his people, Father McGivney showed heroic humility and obedience when the bishop transferred him from St. Mary's Church in New Haven to St. Thomas Church in Thomaston, a small city at the other end of Connecticut. Just as the Knights of Columbus was finally turning the corner of success, its founder let go of his leadership and any sense of it being his personal project to respond in obedience to his bishop. In addition to humility and obedience, he showed his willingness to collaborate with the laymen whom he left in charge.

As I discovered these qualities in the life of Blessed McGivney, I began to ask for his heavenly assistance and was surprised at how quickly my plea was answered. He became my heavenly intercessor who came to my aid and the aid of many people who sought my help and advice.

At one time during the diocesan phase of the cause, a priest asked for prayer cards to take to his mother who was critically ill in the hospital. When he called his mom to tell her he would visit later in the week, he asked how she was faring. She reported that she had been free from pain since a priest visited her and blessed

her. When her son arrived with the prayer cards bearing the image of Father McGivney, she said, "Oh, that's the young priest that visited me; even though he didn't say anything, he did give me his blessing." Many such reports are sent to the Guild office, but most interventions attributed to Blessed McGivney go unreported. They are accepted in faith as God communicates his love and mercy through the intercession of his saints long after their lives on this earth are finished.

I encourage all Guild members to observe August 13 as a day of special prayer in thanksgiving for the beatification of Father McGivney, but also as a day of intercession, commending to his spiritual care the need of our families and friends.

Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.
