ARNAUD BELTRAME

18 April 1973 - 24 March 2018

The Heroism of Arnaud Beltrame

On Friday, WTL pilgrims participated in a procession and prayer service in memory of Arnaud Jean-Georges Beltrame.

Beltrame, a lieutenant colonel in the French Gendarmerie nationale and deputy commander of the Departmental Gendarmerie's Aude unit, was killed by a terrorist at Trèbes after having exchanged himself for a hostage.

The Knights prepared prayer cards in both English and French for the service.

Our American pilgrims began their day by gathering with hundreds of members of the armed forces of Canada, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Norway and other English-speaking nations to celebrate Mass at the Grotto.
